



Mike Wroblewski, a 1996 graduate of Seneca not only ruled the wrestling mat in Erie County at the 130-pound class, he also won the Pa. state championship that year. Mike played baseball in his freshman year as Seneca, was a 4-year letter winner for Seneca in wrestling and was named team captain in both his junior and senior years. Mike was then recruited personally by Olympic great and Edinboro head wrestling coach Bruce Baumgartner. At Edinboro, Mike majored in Criminal Justice and enlisted in the US Army Pennsylvania National Guard in 1997, participating in the Edinboro ROTC program. Upon college graduation in May of 2000, he was commissioned into active duty in the US Army and has served on active duty since then, deploying into combat on five separate occasions while commanding paratroopers and soldiers in combat at the rank of Captain through Lieutenant Colonel. In addition to other military professional and civilian education, Mike also completed Air Assault School, Basic Airborne School, and the U.S. Army Jumpmaster Course. His awards and badges include the Bronze Star, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the Combat Action Badge, Senior Rated Parachutist Badge, the Air Assault Badge, and Irish Foreign Jump Wings.
